EXTENDED page-ranges imply 'passim' – i.e. frequent, but not continuous, reference. Entries for Annie Baxter Dawbin ('ABD': for the name, see p. xlix) appear under 'Dawbin, Annie Baxter'. Robert Dawbin is 'RD'. A bold numeral indicates a principal entry in a footnote or Biographical Notes. Year-chapter numbers, e.g. '(1863)', are frequently used to sub-divide lists of page-references.

A scan of the Index will reveal clusters of related subject terms, e.g.:

- domestic life: alcohol; clothes and material; dogs; drinking, excessive; food and beverages; funerals and mourning; furnishings; furniture; laundry; needlework; schools; servants; sewing machines; wages
- rural life and transport: carriages and carts; cats, native; cattle; emus, as pets; fences and fencing; fires; horses; land; livestock; possums; railways; ships; travel; trees
- music and the visual arts: artists and exhibitions; composers and lyricists of popular songs; music; musical instruments; opera; photography; songs; theatre
- popular culture: balls; churches, chapels and cathedrals; dances and

- dancing; entertainment, popular; games; gardening and gardens; hobbies; soirées; sport; Sundays, social practice
- print culture: authors mentioned or cited; bookshops and sellers; French book; libraries; literary references; magazines; newspapers; publishers; reading, ABD
- *medicine and the body*: accidents and injuries; childbirth; dentists and dentistry; doctors; illness and medical problems; medical treatment and procedures; smoking; surgeons
- sexuality: anecdotes and incidents, sexual; prostitutes; sexual innuendo and suggestiveness; sexual practice, reprehensible
